

DIRECTIONS TO TREE FARM

FROM RICHMOND: I-64 W/I-95 N/I-64 E ramp; right of the fork, follow signs for I-64 W/I-95 N, merge onto I-95 N for 3.6 miles; take a slight right to I-64 W for 99.5 miles; take exit 87 for I-81 N towards Staunton/Winchester, merge onto I-81 N; for 3.2 miles; take exit 225 for VA 262/Woodrow Wilson Parkway for 0.3 miles; left at the fork and follow signs for Woodrow Wilson Parkway/Rt. 11; left turn onto VA 262 S/Woodrow Wilson Parkway and stay for 5.1 miles; take the ramp onto US 250/Churchville Ave. and follow the Staunton directions to the Boys Home Christmas Tree Farm & Gift Shop.

FROM STAUNTON: Rt. 250 W. towards Monterey for 16 miles; left turn onto Rt. 629 (Deerfield Valley Rd.) for 3.5 miles; left turn on Rt. 688 (Old Parkersburg Turnpike) and go 200 yds. to the first right and turn onto Rt. 689 (Bear Wallow Flat); follow signs to Boys Home Christmas Tree Farm & Gift Shop.

FROM COVINGTON: I-64 E to exit 29; left turn onto Rt. 42 N for 16 miles; At Millboro Springs, turn left onto Rt. 39 for 0.5 mile; right turn onto Rt. 678 (Indian Draft Rd); after 8 miles, right turn on to Rt. 629 (Deerfield Valley Rd); after 18 miles, right turn onto Rt. 688 (Old Parkersburg Turnpike); after 200 yds., first right turn onto Rt. 689 (Bear Wallow Flat); follow signs to Boys Home Christmas Tree Farm & Gift Shop.

FROM LEXINGTON: I-64/I-81 for 29.2 miles; exit 220 and merge onto VA 262 N for 5.1 miles; take State Rt. 720/Morris Mill exit and left onto State Rt. 720/Morris Mill Rd. for 1.1 miles; turn right on State Rt. 612/Frog Pond Rd. for 1.9 miles; turn left to follow Staunton directions to Boys Home Christmas Tree Farm & Gift Shop.

Joanne Tannehill, in her bequest, left her Augusta County Christmas Tree Farm to Boys Home as a teaching and learning experience for the residents. Our residents have been actively participating in all aspects of the operation since 1994.

In the spring, the boys place young seedlings in planting beds and relocate mature transplants to the tree fields. In the summer and fall, they shear trees and groom fields. During the winter, they harvest trees for wholesale and assist with the "choose & cut" sales at the Farm.

In 1997, we updated the Gift Shop. This year be sure to take a walking tour of the tree fields and observe the progress we have made in the variety, quality, and quantity of trees we have planted.
