ABE ASHEBIR ALUMNI CORNER

As a young child, Abe moved from Ethiopia to Silver Springs, Maryland. The adjustment was a challenge, causing him to fall behind in school as he was assimilating to a new culture and learning English. At age 11, Abe arrived at Boys Home in 2011. Abe would attend public school for several years but would spend his junior and senior years at Boys Home School. After receiving a more individualized education and staff support, he successfully graduated high school in 2019. At graduation, he received the prestigious George Floyd Rogers Award. The award is given to a senior who by his spirit and example displays the positive qualities of Boys Home's founder.

During his eight years in the program, Abe enjoyed working on the farm, the equine program, soccer and the five years he spent on the Boys Home basketball team. Abe attributed his success at Boys Home to helpful and dedicated staff. He stated, "My houseparent, Linda Angle, became like a second mother to me. I also had a lot of support from Donnie and Bonnie Wheatley, Ronnie Angle, Donnie Costigan, Aaron Smith and many more. They offered me guidance, a nurturing environment and instilled confidence. The staff gave me clear standards, helped me achieve my goals and assisted me in setting even higher ambitions. I believe that these skills have given me a head start over my peers. I gained abilities in working with others, discipline and proper cleaning skills. Not every young adult knows how to clean! I also learned the importance of manners. In my four years away from Boys Home, I am truly seeing the value of the program and the knowledge I can utilize throughout my life."

While reminiscing on his time at Boys Home, Abe was asked about a favorite tradition. Boys Home is rich in traditions. He said, "Christmas was a lot of fun and loud! It was a special night when we all came together to celebrate and receive gifts. Many kids wouldn't experience this kind of Christmas without Boys Home. Everyone looked forward to this special time of year."

After graduating from Boys Home School in 2019, Abe attended Radford University. In May 2023, he graduated with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a major in economics and a minor in finance. This is a tremendous accomplishment and is celebrated in the Boys Home community. He currently resides in Richmond, Virginia, where he is employed by the auditors of public accountants as an auditor for the state of Virginia. Abe's long-term goal is to establish a career in corporate finance. He is currently pursuing a Master of Business degree from Radford University. Abe is an incredible testament to the Boys Home program. Boys Home was the place where he gained a better understanding of who he was as a person and unlocked his full potential to achieve great success!











BRING ON THE BOYS HOME BEARS

In the early years of Boys Home, students were nicknamed Hilltoppers. The name was born out of the mountainous location of the campus. When athletic programs began, it was only natural that the team's name would be the Boys Home Hilltoppers. However, there was never a mascot. Sometime in the late 1960's, the name was changed to Boys Home Indians. The designation remained until the late 1990's when it reverted to Hilltoppers.

When Donnie Costigan was named athletic and recreation director in spring 2022, he was motivated to find ways to build team spirit. One of his ideas was to create a new mascot for Boys Home. As an alumnus, Donnie proudly wore the Boys Home Indians basketball jersey from 1990 to 1994 and still holds the record as the second all-time leading scorer. He stated, "I took a lot of pride in wearing that jersey. The mascot was so much more than the representation of a place, team or school. It embodied the mission, values, character and legacy of Boys Home. I want the current students to enjoy that same feeling. I am hoping the new mascot will increase student engagement, school pride and spirit for many years to come."

After Mr. Costigan consulted with Mr. Doyle about the process for adopting a new mascot, the mascot challenge began. The plan was that the students would be empowered to help choose the new mascot. The process started with students and staff submitting their ideas for potential new mascots. Two rounds of student voting narrowed the choices down to three finalists. In the final vote, the Boys Home Bears won by an overwhelming majority. Boys Home worked with the agency Becker & Weaver to develop the new branding elements. Mr. Doyle stated, "We could have purchased the rights to a generic bear logo, but we wanted something customized and unique to Boys Home. I am proud that we gave students a voice in the process and look forward to the sense of pride they will have in being the Boys Home Bears."

The new mascot was revealed at a pep rally for the soccer team and all students received a navy-blue sweatshirt with the new mascot. The crest logo will remain the traditional logo for Boys Home, while the Bear logos will be used for athletics. Please join us in cheering on the Boys Home Bears as they compete in fall soccer, basketball and spring soccer. Go Boys Home Bears!
